No Meetings January 28 and 29, You Can say “No” to Giving Up Prep

January 28 is a work day, in the buildings, to prepare for the second semester. There should be no meetings unless the member initiates one, or if there are IEP dates that cannot be scheduled around this date. January 29 is a grade prep day, again with no meetings. Members with grade preparation duties may work off-site. Members who do not have grading responsibilities sometimes arrange with administration to complete other duties off-site.

If you are asked to attend District meetings or workshops that deny you your prep period, you may decline to attend. You are obligated to participate in IEP meetings, and to meet regarding your evaluation and Student Learning Growth Goals, but it can be at your availability.

Educator's Voices Needed - 2016 TELL Oregon Survey (February 1-29, 2016)

Oregon educators have a second opportunity to share vital information about the teaching and learning conditions in their schools. The **Teaching, Empowering, Leading and Learning (TELL) Survey** is a collaborative effort between the Governor's Office, OEA, COSA, OSBA, the Oregon Department of Education and the Chief Education Office.

A growing body of research shows the importance of positive teaching conditions to student learning and teacher retention. Education leaders in Oregon want to hear from every teacher and administrator in order to make the best decisions about facilities and resources, professional development, time for collaboration, and ways for improving instruction. Now in its 2nd year, the TELL Oregon Survey will provide that data and much more.
