## Outsiders' Mailing Goals Not on the Up and Up

If you're a teacher in Oregon, you've certainly received a mailing from the Freedom Foundation or Opt-Out Today. We've written about this to ensure that our members and all licensed HSD staff understand the intent behind these mailings, but we think a refresher is due!

- Groups like Opt-Out and Freedom Foundation are funded by wealthy ultra-right organizations including the Koch and Devos families who have contributed together close to half a million dollars;
- The group's founders have been quoted stating their intent is to weaken the teachers' union;
- The mailings contain mistruths including stating that your dues support legislative candidates
  NOT TRUE! Only voluntary PAC contributions go to support pro-education candidates;
- What do these organizations stand to gain by convincing you to leave the union? Ask yourself how they can help YOU in your profession;
- A strong union means that we have the bargaining power to negotiate our salary and benefits, and the voice to fight for your working conditions. States with strong unions pay their teachers an average of \$12-15,000 more per year. Solidarity forever!

## PERS Changes – What They Mean to You

Oregon legislators passed Senate Bill 1049 in the 2019 Session. OEA vehemently opposed this bill because there were other solutions and the amount generated by this reduction to your benefits is minor and unfair to put on your backs. Nonetheless, the impact of this legislation is a 1-2% reduction in the amount going to the Individual Account Program (IAP). Literally, your own 6% contribution will be reduced by 2.5% if Tier 1 or 2, and .75% if you are OPSRP (Tier 3). HEA and OEA will be looking for ways to minimize or counteract this reduction through negotiations or future legislation. # Article 9, Section D – Involuntary Transfers Between Buildings (Or a change in an assignment) Covers change in assignment after the start of the school year:

"Any member transferred to another building or classroom due to district need, or who gets a 50 percent change in assignment to accommodate the district after August 15...shall be given up to two (2) days at the discretion of the building administrator. Days may be paid or substitute time at the member's discretion." See your building rep if you have questions.
