Tax Breaks for Teachers

The Internal Revenue Service has changed the amount teachers can deduct for out-of-pocket classroom expenses. For tax years 2012 through 2021, the limit teachers could deduct for out-of-pocket classroom expenses for things like books, materials and other educational supplies was \$250 per year. For 2022, that amount has been raised to a maximum of \$300 and will increase in \$50 increments in future years based on inflation. <u>Read More</u>
