HEA Delegates Bring Concerns to the OEA Representative Assembly

Hillsboro members successfully brought legislative focus to the OEA Representative Assembly:

Katherine Nelson (EMS) successfully passed a Legislative Objective, directing OEA lobbyists and the OEA Legislative Action Committee (LAC) to focus on improving the physical security infrastructure of Oregon public school buildings, as well as bringing much-needed supports for mental health services to prevent violent behavior.

Angela Vargas, (Henry ES), successfully advocated for transportation for Title I schools, to change the required distance from 1.0 to 0.5 miles. In Title I schools, which are in lower SES neighborhoods, many families have to choose between their jobs and safe transportation for their children.

Working with colleagues from other locals, Angela also helped pass expansion of the online OEA Toolkit to more broadly share parental rights regarding the high-stakes standardized tests and the right to opt-out. Information regarding the costs of implementation (devices used, time from instruction, bandwidth requirements) will also be publicized.
